

ALZHEIMER'S WALK



Best Nursing Homes 2023 By Newsweek

Newsweek voted Birmingham Green as one of the 'Best Nursing Homes 2023.' The rankings were based on four criteria that matter most when choosing a nursing home. Existing criteria included scores for performance data, reputation, and COVID-19. An additional score for facilities accredited by the Joint Commission International, an independent, non-profit health care standards organization, was added.

In light of the pandemic, Newsweek's COVID-19 score was measured using the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) data to identify nursing homes with the best response and protocols for COVID-19. Birmingham Green continues to provide weekly COVID-19 updates for residents, families, team members, and the community, to uphold our ongoing commitment to the safety and well-being of those on our <u>campus</u>.







CMS Five-Star Rating

Our Skilled Nursing facility earned a Five-Star designation for Quality Measures by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). This Five-Star Rating is based on several Long-Stay and Short-Stay Quality Measures, and we scored better than the state/national average in multiple categories.

This acknowledgment is an amazing indication of the everyday care and compassion our team at Birmingham Green provides for our residents. Our standard of excellence is evident in everything we do and we are committed to providing the highest level of compassionate care for our residents and their families. Our History





Birmingham Green has a proud history as a financially accessible senior living facility in Northern Virginia.

For more than 90 years, Birmingham Green has been home to Northern Virginians needing long-term care, but do not necessarily have the personal resources to afford the services. Birmingham Green has continually provided dignified, caring assistance to our residents.

Dating back to 1926, five localities in our region established a home for those who, for a variety of reasons, did not have the ability to care for themselves. Prince William, Fairfax, Loudoun, Fauquier, and the City of Alexandria purchased a 54-acre site on Centreville Road in Manassas, Virginia — a part of a larger region known as Birmingham Green. There, they built the District Home of Northern Virginia to provide food, shelter, and employment opportunities for those who needed it most in the area.

The original District Home was built on farmland, which, for nearly 20 years, many residents enjoyed helping to maintain. By the 1950s, District Home was expanded to accommodate 80 residents, and became a licensed rest home to care for the area's lowest-income community members with disabilities.



Our History

Today, the campus – notably named Birmingham Green – is comprised of the licensed 64-bed District Home Assisted Living that is currently operating as a 30-bed facility, a 180-bed Northern Virginia Health Care Commission that opened in 1991 to provide nursing and rehab services, and the Willow Oaks Assisted Living, a 92unit supportive housing facility that opened in 2008 to offer additional assisted living services.

In addition, Birmingham Green continues to fill a very unique and irreplaceable public-private partnership role that continues to be true to our historical mission for who we serve. The Northern Virginia Health Care Commission is a 94 percent Medicaid facility, the only such facility in Northern Virginia. Willow Oaks Assisted Living is a 100 percent Auxiliary Grant facility, also the only such facility in Northern Virginia that has dedicated all of its units to the state-administered grant program. Both facilities operate off community funds from the local governments to make up the difference between state reimbursements and the full costs of senior living care. Birmingham Green has also been taking the initiative to anticipate the future, both in the depth and diversity of the needs, and the preferences of who we serve.

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


